CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION

A huge shout out to the Soledad Rotary Club for furnishing our 3rd grade students with their own personal dictionaries! We are honored to be partnered with such a caring group.

Instructional Focus

Our instructional focus is on Rigorous Reading. This last week we learned how to compare grade level content standards and how to address comprehending complex texts. We learned the importance of offering students complex text. We also revisited the Gradual Release of Responsibility Model. We learned every lesson; every day should have all components of GRR. We talked about how we all do: Guided Instruction, Focused Instruction, Collaborative Learning, and Independent Learning. We learned that it is not necessary to do GRR in a specific order; rather we learned the importance of making sure we are doing the components in our daily lessons.



If you would like to stay in front of our staff meeting learning, I highly suggest you pre-read chapter 1 (Ramping Up for Complex Texts) and chapter 2 (Purpose and Modeling). We have already covered Complex Text, but we will be learning about Purpose and Modeling soon.

For our next staff meeting, we will be finishing up chapter 1. It is important that we are very familiar with the Rigorous Reading content. Instructional rounds are coming soon. I am eager to share the amazing teaching that is happening at San Vi! Just to be clear – during the instructional rounds, we will be seeing evidence of:

Access to complex text

GRR

Purpose & Modeling
