Why Classroom Talk? Michael Halliday (1993) states that 'when children learn language they are not simply engaging in one type of learning among many; rather, they are learning the foundations of learning itself'. As educators, we know that learning is social and that peer interactions help extend understanding. Robin Alexander (2000) affirms that: "Dialogic teaching harnesses the power of talk to stimulate and extend students' thinking and advance their learning and understanding".

FOCUS OF THE WEEK

Increase Student Talk



- Divide your students into pairs and groups so they can work together to do tasks and activities - this is more interesting than doing it alone, and students can learn from each other.
- When a student asks a question, don't just give the answer. Ask him a question or give him a clue to help him think of the answer. Let him work his way towards the answer and get him to talk about what he thinks.
- Ask other students to give explanations or definitions rather than you – see what others know before you tell them. We're always amazed at how much a group of students knows between them.
- Ask open questions requiring longer answers, not just Yes/No answers - so questions with 'what', 'why', 'when', 'how', and so on.
- Don't finish student answers/sentences for them – allow them to think things through, even if they're finding it tough.
