Parents used a strategy called First Turn, Last Turn to discuss the article "What Smarter Balanced Assessments will mean for Students, Families, Teachers, and Legislators." Parents enjoyed learning in a format that simulated the way their students are learning in the 21st century classroom. After learning more about our standardized testing system, we completed "Catch-up Plans" and discussed more strategies of how parents can help their students be more successful on CELDT.

First Turn/Last Turn

Information Processing: Exploring and Discovering

PROCESS

- Form groups of four to eight.
- Silently and simultaneously, members read a section of text and highlight three or four items that have particular meaning for them.
- The facilitator names a person to start in each group.
- In turn, members share one of their items but do not comment on it. They simply name it.
- In round-robin fashion, group members comment about the identified item with no cross-talk.
- The initial person who named the item now shares his or her thinking about the item, and therefore, gets the last turn.
- Repeat the pattern around the table.
